	The Neurosequential Model is a developmentally sensitive and neurobiologically informed approach to clinical problem solving. This model has been implemented in multiple clinical populations across the full developmental spectrum (infants to adults) and is most widely used with traumatized and maltreated children. Its utility is most apparent with the most complex cases of maltreatment and psychological trauma, and its application will be the focus of this workshop. Individual and family case studies will be presented for Dr. Perry to discuss and provide hands-on skills development in the areas of prevention, assessment, and intervention using the Neurosequential Model.
