A 501(c)3 nonprofit helping military and veteran families in crisis build financial self-sufficiency through counseling, grants, and additional support programs.

Who We Serve:

- Enlisted service members in pay-grades E1 to E6 when unexpected financial hardship or crisis strikes and crucial living expenses cannot be met
- Veterans within the first 18 months following an honorable discharge
- Families stationed at, or recently discharged, from any of 16 military installations and 2 medical centers in Southern California
- All branches of the Armed Services, Coast Guard, as well as federally activated
 National Guard and activated Reserves

In-depth financial counseling, coupled with grants* for:

- Rent & Mortgage

- * Financial support provided as a grant, not a loan, and are paid directly to service providers or in the form of commissary or retail gift cards

Why We Serve:

- High Cost of Living in Southern California
 30% higher with housing rates almost double the national average
- Enlisted Military = Smaller Compensation Packages
 100% of service members falling with the E1-E4 pay grades (with allowances) are considered low income according to HUD guidelines
- Relatively Young Families with Different Challenges and Varying Financial Skills
 Deployments, family moves, spouse employment, childcare

These factors combine to put families on the brink of financial crisis. STEP social workers provide financial counseling and education, budgeting, goal setting, and other financial tools to put these families on a path to permanent financial self-sufficiency.

Transitions can bring about changes in roles and duties. Family members may take on new responsibilities, and children may have different reactions. Many adapt well, but changes in behavior are normal. Couples may experience a number of stressors that can have an effect on their relationship. While many couples know how to manage common challenges associated with military service, some experience periods of miscommunication that can make their connection feel distant.

FOCUS helps strengthen couples and families in readiness for tomorrow by building on their current strengths and teaching new strategies specifically designed to meet their needs.

FOCUS for Families guides families as they build their own story about military life experiences over 6 to 8 modules. This helps families to:

- · Identify, manage, and discuss emotions
- · Clarify misunderstandings and respect individual points of view
- · Build on family strengths
- · Feel closer and more supported
- Use problem-solving and goal-setting to empower the entire family

FOCUS for **Couples** delivers hands-on education and training in 6 to 8 modules, modules focusing on specific skills. These strengthen couples' ability to:

- Improve their understanding of each others' experiences
- Increase relationship closeness
- · Talk to one another and provide support
- · Work toward a common goal
- · Feel hope and optimism for their future together



FOCUS also provides specialized services for families of **recovering warriors**.

These services:

- Improve family communication about the injury or illness
- Set goals for family care routines Problem-solve around family challenges
 - Enhance understanding about deployment reminders, combat stress, injuries and the recovery journey.
