YMCA OF SAN DIEGO COUNTY CHILDCARE RESOURCE SERVICE

First 5 San Diego exists to promote the health and well-being of young children, ages 0-5, and this mission took on new meaning as our community faced the COVID-19 pandemic. With essential workers working longer hours and vulnerable families facing uncertainty, **access to child care was imperative.**

In response, First 5 San Diego provided \$500,000 in emergency child care vouchers to cover the cost of child care from May through June 2020 for children, ages 0-5, as prioritized by State Management Bulletin 20-06. Under this document, vouchers covered the cost of child care for families involved with child welfare system, families experiencing homelessness, and families in essential worker functions across income levels. Funds were generously provided by First 5 San Diego and administered in partnership with San Diego County Office of Education, Jewish Family Services, and San Diego for Every Child.

YMCA CRS provided 275 families with vouchers from First 5 funds. Since April 2020, YMCA CRS connected **339 children** with child care services.

56% of enrolled children live in a single-parent household while **44%** of enrolled children live in a two-parent household.

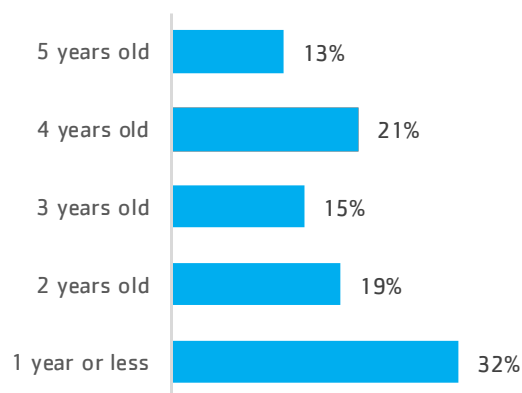


The average age of children who are provided First 5 funding is **2 years old.**

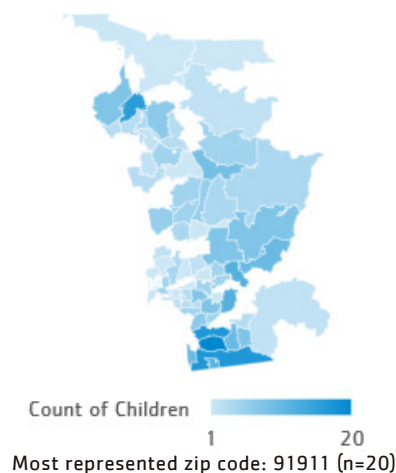


The majority of enrolled children, **53%**, are Hispanic or Latino.

FAMILIES



79% of families received funding to pay for child care for one child, **19%** received funding for two children, and **2%** received funding for three children.

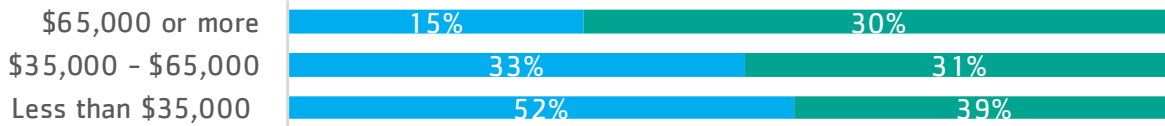


The average family size for a **single-parent household is 3** while a **two-parent household is 5.1**.



76% of families earn under the **85% State Median Income (SMI)** ceiling while **24%** earn above this ceiling.

NUMBER OF ENROLLED CHILDREN BY HOUSEHOLD TYPE



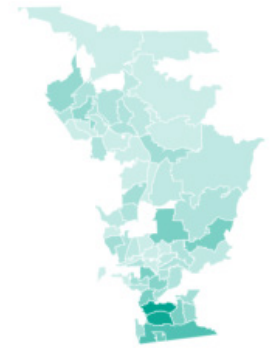
● Single-Parent Household ● Two-Parent Household

ZIP CODE DISTRIBUTION AMONG PROVIDERS

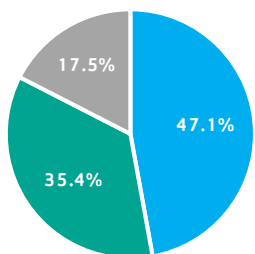


Count of Providers 1 16

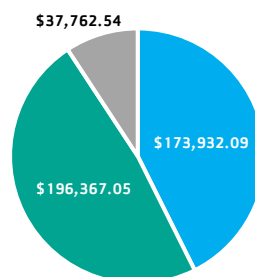

TOTAL PAYMENTS ISSUED BY PROVIDER TYPE



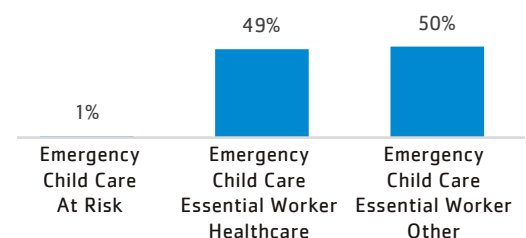
As of 08/05/2020, 330 of 339 authorized children have had at least one payment issued on their behalf.

In order to receive child care assistance from First 5 funds, **parents had to be considered at risk or work in California's essential critical infrastructure** as defined in Executive Order NN-33-20 and prioritized in State Management Bulletin 20-06.
